#### Books by RUSIV Members

Colonel Jim Wood, ED (1937-2017) was an active contributor to RUSIV over many years. Born in Sydney he became one of the early members of 1<sup>st</sup> Commando Company qualifying as a green beret, parachutist and in commando other skills. Among his military appointments were Commanding Officer of Melbourne University

Regiment (1979-1981) and Colonel Project Officer at Army Command and Staff College, Queenscliff.

Jim was the author of *The Forgotten Force: Australia's Military Contribution to the Occupation of Japan 1945 - 1952 (1998)* and *Chiefs of the Australian Army: Higher Command of the Australian Military Forces 1901-1914 (2006)*. He also published his work on Mobilisation which he researched as a Defence Fellow. All these items are in our library.

Major E.W.O. Perry appointed Jim as his literary executor and passed his military library to him on his death. Dr Colleen Wood, Jim's wife, passed these valuable and irreplaceable books on to our RUSIV Library, greatly improving our collection.
