Advice for Vehicle Drivers

The first Holden, manufactured by General Motors-Holden Ltd (GMH), was the Holden 48-215, also known as the Holden FX, was launched in 1948.

Prior to 1948, GMH had produced bodies for vehicles made by General Motors in USA and UK. In 1941 GMH issued a 42-page booklet to the Australian Army called *For B.F.s* in what it described as an "unexpurgated ed." With illistrations by Douglas of *Punch*, it showed how careless driving and servicing could damage military vehicles. It was a copy of the same title issued by Vauxhall Motors in UK.



In its introduction it said "We like to regard this little book as a means to an end. We hope you will find it amusing, but we hope also that you will not miss-the serious purpose underlying the rather light-hearted style. If you become a better driver after reading it and learn to handle your car or truck with greater care and understanding — well, we shall feel we have succeeded in our purpose."

The 164-year-old GMH ceased trading at the end of 2020.
