#### A Prisoner of the Ottomans



Guests of the Unspeakable was written by Thomas White (1888 - 1957). As an officer in the Australian Flying Corps while on a mission to cut telegraph wires near Baghdad on 13 November 1915, he was captured by Arabs and Turks. Imprisoned in Turkey, he escaped from a train in Constantinople (Istanbul) in July 1918, sailed to Odessa, Ukraine, Russia, as a stowaway in a cargo ship and reached London on 22 December. His book is an account of his adventures – he does not flatter his captors.

"The Opportunity Club Collingwood" most probably refers to the Collingwood Football Club, which has a strong focus on providing opportunities for its members, staff, and the wider community.

White is buried alongside his wife Vera (née Deakin) in the Point Londale cemetery, Victoria. Vera (1891 – 1978) had founded the Australian Wounded and Missing Inquiry Bureau which performed heroic work firstly in Cairo and then in London during the First World War.

The book must have joined the collection of the Nunawading Library. In sadly typical municipal library fashion, it was disposed of but is now valued as one of the rare books in the RUSIV library.
