#### Scarlet Beach

At dawn on 22 September 1943 the 20th Brigade, commanded by Brig J.V. Windeyer, was landed by Rear Admiral Daniel Barbey's US Navy Task Force. Scarlet Beach was strongly defended by the well-entrenched Japanese. They were beaten back after several days of fierce fighting. This was Australia's first opposed amphibious landing of the war – a preliminary operation prior to the capture of Finschhafen which

would be developed into an airfield base to attack the Japanese.

Prior to dawn on 17 October Japanese launched a counterattack from several flanks including from the sea in barges. Attacking along a wide front, the main Japanese thrust was made between the Song and Siki Rivers, where groups broke through the Australian lines and reached the beach. The Japanese counterattack lasted for about a week and resulted in a small contraction of the Australian lines and a splitting of their force before it was defeated. By the end of October 1943 the Japanese main force withdrew to Sattelberg, suffering heavy casualties.
