Infantry Training 1902





This is at present our earliest British Infantry training manual. In the preface Field Marshal Lord Roberts wrote *inter alia*:

"The officers of His Majesty's army are enjoined to devote their utmost attention to carrying out the system of training laid down in this manual, the aim of which is to secure, at the decisive moment of battle, the greatest development of fire, from the most effective direction, and under the strictest general

The backbone of a thorough miltary training is the careful and gradual instruction of the individual or soldier, in every duty he may be called on to fulfil, and the development to the utmost of his mental and physical powers.

But such development is impossible unless free play is given to individual intelligence and therefore forbidden to, limit or restrict the freedom granted in these regulations to battalion and company commanders, both as regards methods of instruction and the leading of their men in action."

Despite these words, the reliance on massed drill advocated in this pamphlet would have been fatal in the First World War. However, this manual would have several revisions prior to that conflict.

This copy belonged to Sergeant Thos. Bell of the 1st Dunfriesshire Volunteer Regiment of Militia – a unit that has disappeared due to subsequent amalgamations.
